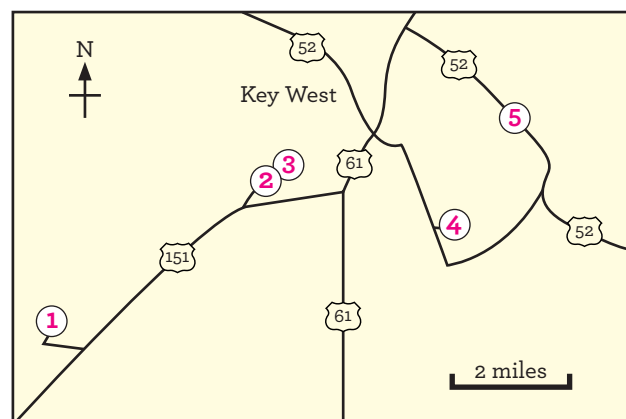

1. Bruce & Carleen Rehmke (Master Gardener) 15547 Abbey Circle, Peosta, IA

WOODS EDGE GARDEN

Woods Edge Garden has been a labor of love for many years. Located on two acres and surrounding their home on Abbey Circle in rural Dubuque County, it consists of several garden “rooms,” each with its own personality. There is a raised vegetable garden bed, a sunny flower garden, a shade garden, a hosta garden, and several smaller areas with a mixture of perennial and annual plants. A number of fountains, benches, and statues add to the serenity of the setting.

WORKSHOP Master Gardeners 101 (Who, What & Why)

DIRECTIONS - Take US 151/61 S out of Dubuque and take the US 151-exit. Go 5.3 miles and turn right onto Monastery Road and go 0.7 miles. Turn right onto Abbey Circle. Watch for signs to the garden. There are two entrances off of Monastery Road for Abbey Circle. Both will take you to the garden.

2. Judy & Steve Selchert (Master Gardener) 8753 Jennifer Court, Dubuque, IA

COUNTRY HAVEN

Country Haven is a shady garden evolving over 40 years with hundreds of hostas and other shade loving perennials. The small pond and feeders attract many birds, and even a turtle or two. Vegetables are interspersed in sunny areas to supplement the small veggie garden.

DIRECTIONS - Take US 151 S and turn right onto Maquoketa Drive. Turn left onto Key W Drive and a slight right onto Military Road. Go 2.7 miles and turn left onto Amy Drive. Turn right onto Jennifer Court.

3. Ken & Kathy Legrand 11472 Amy Drive, Dubuque, IA

LEARNING AS WE “GROW”

Ken has the green thumb, Kathy is the go-fer! They have many fruit trees including apple, peach, cherry, pear, and plum. Ken’s large patch of blackberries produces several gallons of berries and they also have raspberries, grapes, blueberries, and strawberries. The Legrand’s have an assortment of perennials, grow many varieties of vegetables in raised beds, and have a maple tree that is tapped to make syrup.

DIRECTIONS - From Military Road, stay on Amy Drive and the garden is on the right.

4. LouAnn & Dan Arensdorf (Master Gardener) 8785 Scenic Hill Lane, Dubuque IA

HYDRANGEA WATERFALL PARADISE

With a love for hydrangeas, it is no wonder that there are over 100 bushes with 25 different varieties gracing three acres. A backyard pondless waterfall, with four drops, cascades under an arched foot bridge, designed and created by owners. You will find many different perennials such as peonies, agastache, bleeding hearts, black eyed susans, daylilies, coneflowers, roses, hybrid tree and Asiatic lilies, hostas, and clematis. The variety of other native and pollinator perennials create spectacular color from May through October.

WORKSHOP Hydrangeas
11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

DIRECTIONS - Take US 61 S to 52 W (SW Arterial) and turn left. Southwest Arterial bypass ends at the Olde Davenport Road. Turn right and go for two miles. Scenic Hill Lane is on the left.

5. Karen & Paul Wagner (Master Gardener) 9824 US 52, Dubuque, IA

7-ACRES OF HEAVEN

Relax on several benches scattered throughout the seven acres. The property has been in Paul’s family since the late 40’s. Gardens include a large vegetable garden with raspberries, blackberries, and a variety of fruit trees. With over 30 flower gardens (large and small) there is a wide variety of hostas (over 200 labeled), perennials, annuals, shrubs, mature trees, and also containers of flowers.

DIRECTIONS - Take 52 South toward Bellevue off Hwy 61/151, 2.5 miles from intersection. The garden is on the left with red, white, and blue banner.
